

Western Australian Certificate of Education (WACE) (Year 11 & 12)

The Western Australian Certificate of Education (WACE) Years 11 and 12 is an internationally recognized qualification awarded by the School Curriculum and Standards Authority (SCSA), an independent statutory authority that is responsible to the Western Australian Minister for Education. The programme offers both breadth and depth through the study of a range of subjects. All WACE graduates will meet the literacy and numeracy standards set by the SCSA.



Course Objective

The WACE course provides a broad-based foundation in content and skills development to prepare students for undergraduate study at university. By incorporating coursework into the curriculum, the course develops inquiry and writing skills in students, regardless of their native language. Upon graduation, student can apply to universities worldwide including Singapore, the US, the UK and Australia.
